
Interior designers and bathroom renovation experts offer their best tips and tricks for creating a bathroom oasis.

#### Go Bold With More Color






## **Make the Vanity Functional**

#### **Double the Shower**

"Double showers are a must! We often recommend double showers with rain heads, hand-held features, and multiple faucets to create a truly relaxing experience. Another option is adding a body sprayer, which we will customize to the customer's height so it hits perfectly. A mistake people make in their bathrooms is installing their showerheads too far from each other. A good rule of thumb would be to position them roughly one foot away from one another. Another popular addition is technology that allows everything to be controlled from your phone or an iPad on the wall." –Joseph Tsedaka, principal at NOMI, Dallas


